Aerosols

Recently on the school bus there was a very serious incident involving the spraying of a deodorant aerosol in an enclosed space. This caused one of our pupils to have a severe asthma attack. The pupil has made a recovery however the consequences could quite easily have been catastrophic. Because of this, to safeguard our pupils whilst in school and travelling to and from school, we have decided to ban the use of any aerosols from the site.

Pupils should not have aerosols on their person whilst attending Holy Family.

Should pupils wish to bring deodorants to school for use after PE and the like, they should be of the 'roll on' variety. We would be grateful if you could discuss this with your child and look forward to your ongoing support around the matter.




Head of House

Holy Family Catholic High School has had a long association through our 'House' system with the Beaumont family, Cardinal Hinsley, the Howard family and Cardinal Newman. At the moment pupils in our 'houses' compete against each other in various activities and we wish to build on this great tradition by establishing our pastoral system around this heritage.

From September 2017 the role of Head of Year will be replaced by the role of Head of House.

The Head of House will take on the pastoral well-being, development and safeguarding of approximately 120 pupils from across the five year groups. They will replace the Head of Year role as the first point of contact at school for parents and carers. There will be no alterations around tutor groups for pupils already with us in years 7, 8, 9 and 10 as they move up the school next year and we will begin to ensure that pupils are placed in the same houses as their siblings starting with the transition of our 2017/18 Year 7 cohort. This should allow families to have easy access to an identified 'Head of House' who in turn will have growing knowledge of individual family circumstances.

York and District Athletics

Following the Selby and District qualifiers earlier in the week, pupils from years 7 to 10 competed in the York Athletics Championship on Wednesday afternoon at the splendid facility that is York University. Dear Parent/Guardian

As you are aware, at Holy Family Catholic High School, all staff work hard to encourage pupils to maintain the high standards of school uniform. We feel that maintaining these high standards gives pupils pride in themselves and teaches them the appropriate type of dress for different occasions.

Following recent uniform monitoring it has come to our attention that some girls are continuing to wear **short, black tubular skirts** which are not permitted. We do not deem these as appropriate for school. As a result of repeated washing and drying some of these skirts have lost elasticity and often sit well above the knee, compromising the modesty of some pupils. This type of skirt therefore should not be worn. As a Catholic school adhering to the uniform policy allows each child a sense of belonging and more importantly dignity. We feel strongly that this type of skirt does not afford this.

As you can see from the details that I have taken from pupil planners overleaf, this type of skirt is already not permitted. If your daughter is currently wearing a tubular type skirt please ensure that it is no longer worn after the May half term.

Please use the guidelines to check other aspects of your child's uniform. If you have any other queries, please contact their Head of Year in the first instance.

Our uniform policy is intended to foster a feeling of belonging and identity for all Holy Family pupils. Our standards are high and as such are in keeping with a modern workplace environment.

<p>Plain, navy blue BLAZER with Holy Family badge. <i>Year 11 students are permitted to wear a black v-neck school jumper instead of a blazer. These can be purchased from the Uniform Shop, 26 – 28 Pasture Road, Goole, DN14 6EZ.</i></p>	<p>No other type of fitted jackets.</p>
<p>Plain white SHIRT which buttons up to the collar, suitable for wearing with a tie and long enough to be tucked into trousers or a skirt.</p>	<p>No T-shirts or polo shirts. No cropped or tailored shirts or blouses.</p>
<p>Holy Family tie. Top button must be fastened.</p>	<p>Students should not come to school without a tie.</p>
<p>A plain, grey v-neck SWEATER or CARDIGAN of blazer length can be worn <u>underneath blazers</u> in colder weather.</p>	<p>No sweatshirts, vests, strappy tops, hooded tops, T-shirts or zipped cardigans. No 'designer' brands.</p>
<p>Plain black, full length TROUSERS or plain black SKIRT of moderate length (to the knee).</p>	<p>No denim, chino or jeans style trousers, cropped, low-cut, decorated trousers or 'tube' type skirts.</p>
<p>Plain, black BELT, if required, which fits through trouser or skirt loopholes and has a small, plain BUCKLE.</p>	<p>No coloured or decorated belts. No large or designer buckles.</p>
<p>Plain black or brown school SHOES.</p>	<p>No trainers, canvas shoes or footwear with coloured stripes, designer logos or other decoration. No backless shoes, flip-flops or stiletto heels.</p>
<p>TOPCOATS may be worn in colder weather but not in place of school blazers.</p>	<p>No denim or leather jackets, track-suit type tops or 'hoodies'.</p>
<p>All students must have a BAG large enough to carry all books and equipment and must bring their PLANNER to school every day.</p>	<p>Students should not come to school without their planner or equipment for the day.</p>
<p>Light make-up is permitted.</p>	<p>Make-up should be minimal and is at the discretion of the Head of Year who will offer wipes to remove excessive make-up. No false nails and if worn, nail varnish should be neutral.</p>
<p>One pair of studs in ear lobes only allowed.</p>	<p>No large, hooped or dangling earrings. No body or facial piercings. No jewellery.</p>
<p>HAIRSTYLES should be moderate and in all aspects</p>	<p>No unnatural hair colourings or extreme styles. No shaven designs, including tramlines.</p>
