

The Holy Family Catholic High School Newsletter December 2020

Dear Parents and Carers,

We come to the end of the first term of this academic year and we give thanks for the support of our whole community. Together we have ensured that our young people have continued learning, supported by dedicated teachers and teaching assistants and caring families. Our students have been able to enjoy the social aspects of school in their year group bubbles and get back to some 'normality'.

We feel blessed that we have only had to contact a couple of students to self-isolate due to contact with a positive case in school. Our school attendance is well above the national figures, we have had 94% attendance this term compared with the national average of 87%.

Everyone in school has learnt new technology skills! Staff have taken part in training on Microsoft 'Teams' and 'Loom' to enhance our remote and 'in-school' teaching and learning. Our students have also improved their skills including uploading work, using 'Teams' and Classcharts as well as GCSEPOD and Kahoot. A group of our students have also edited our Carol Service and Talent show! We have had overwhelmingly positive feedback from parents who accessed the virtual parents evening, many felt it was better than coming into school as it was more private and less frantic!



Mrs Mackintosh (pictured left) was overwhelmed to receive a hamper and on her birthday as well! Many happy returns from all of us at Holy Family.




Combined Cadet Force - A brief update from our cadets:

Further Maths Club

My name is Neve Whitehead, I am currently in year 11 and am a member of the Level 3 Maths class. Level 3 Maths is a course that is designed to help to bridge the gap between Maths at GCSE level and Maths at A-Level. It takes place every Wednesday after school for two hours.

Since September, I have been attending this group with 9 other students in order to further our Maths education. Many of us intend to continue our study of Maths further than GCSE whether that be as A-level, Further Maths Alevel, Physics A-level or even Engineering. However, even for those who do not wish to continue their study of Maths beyond high school, the course still has great benefits at GCSE level. Further Maths is a great way, not only to get a taster of the sorts of topics that you will cover past GCSE, but also to aid and boost your accessibility of the harder, grade 8/9 questions that you will face at GCSE. The group is run by Mr Walter. His love and passion for the subject (along with the weekly tub of chocolates that he brings) makes learning the subject so enjoyable, even when it can be very difficult! So far, we have covered around 2/3 of the total course, including areas such as binomial expansion, integration and differentiation, polynomial division, and many more things that up until now, I did not have the faintest clue existed! At the end of the course, we have the choice whether we would like to sit an exam or not. From the very be-

ginning, it has been clear that there is no pressure for us to sit it, as even just learning the course can give us a massive boost when taking Maths at higher level. The exam takes place around the same time as GCSE and it is acknowledged by colleges & also universities as it warrants UCAS points. I have really enjoyed the course and would strongly suggest to the younger year groups, who are given the opportunity, to seize it. Whilst it may be challenging, and often leave you many times lost for words, learning more about Maths and the way the world works is something that not many people truly get the chance to understand and appreciate.

After the short break, we have taken over the mock exam period, I cannot wait to get back and learn all about 'calculus applications to kinematics'. I would also like to thank the entire Maths department for providing this opportunity to us. Academisation Update – The latest date we have been given by the DfE for Holy Family to join the Bishop Konstant Catholic Multi Academy Trust is now 01 March 2021

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Initial information states that this will be for students who have been in close contact with a positive case in school. Parents can choose for their child to be tested and they would not have to self-isolate if the test was negative. Staff will be offered weekly tests. When we have the 'finer detail' we will be in touch.

Please note that the testing in schools will not start immediately in the new term.

When we have all the information, training and resources we will send out further details. Please be assured that no child will be tested without prior consent from parents. It is also clear that we also have to remain vigilant and continue all the things

we have in place in line with the national guidance:

Washing hands, using sanitiser and wearing face masks in corridors and on buses. Windows and doors open for ventilation, extra cleaning regimes in school, year group zones and staff staying 2m apart from other staff and students.

Over the holiday... If your child develops symptoms in the 48 hours from when they break up and they test positive you need to inform us of full details via the enquiry email which will be monitored up to Christmas Eve. Schools have been instructed to contact the close school contacts of a positive case and ask them to self-isolate for 10 days. If your child is asymptomatic and tests positive it is close contacts in the 48 hours before the test who have to self-isolate. We also ask that you inform us, via the enquiry email, if your child will not be returning on the 5th January due to self isolation. <u>enquiry@holyfamilycarlton.org</u>
