
School Choir:

"I originally had my reservations about the additional maths course, but I am glad I decided to take it because I feel it gives me an insight into A-level Maths that you do not get from GCSE. There are 11 of us in the group and so far, we have covered polynomials, stretching polynomials, binomial expansion and binomial probability. I think it has pushed me academically and proved to be of great interest and a huge help with general maths skills. As well as this, I believe it will somewhat prepare me for the knowledge gap between GCSE and A-level Maths, and I look forward to further extending my knowledge in future classes."


Mission Chapel Lessons




Family Fast Day- CAFOD Appeal

COLLEGE TALKS

Post-16 Options

I would like to take this opportunity to give you a brief overview of the pupils' choices after they leave Holy Family. All pupils must do one of the following:

- stay in full-time education, for example at school, sixth form college or further education college
- start an apprenticeship or traineeship
- spend 20 hours or more a week working or volunteering while also doing part-time education or training


You child may be eligible for the 16 to 19 Bursary Fund, which can help with things like books, travel or equipment if you will struggle with education or training costs. If your child has an Education Health and Care (EHC) plan, you can get support to choose your next steps and extra help when you are in education, training or work. Giving the pupils the opportunity to engage with a wide range of employers and employees is a fundamental part of the Careers Education that pupils receive here at Holy Family.
